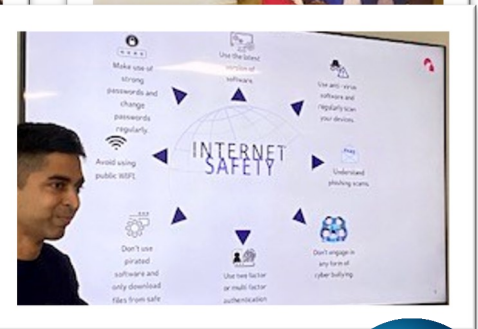
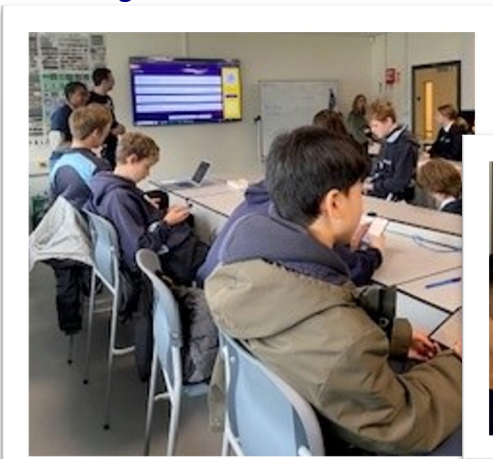
In collaboration with the Main St John's account, the Careers department has also set up a new BlueSky account, with the same handle as on X. Follow @STJCareers to keep in touch

- All forms are sent by email. It is important that employers are told to expect an email from noreply@unifrog.org. Please tell them to check their junk/spam folders if they are expecting an email and haven't received it.
- Friday 25th April is the deadline for Year 10, and Friday 9th May for Year 12 to complete ALL forms, so students need to ensure they input their information with enough time for employers and parents to also complete their forms.
