Dear Applicant to St John's Sixth Form and Parents

Following your successful interview for St John's Sixth Form, I am pleased to confirm that we are able to offer you a place for September 2021 which is conditional on achieving the necessary grades for the courses you have applied to study.

As a reminder, the minimum entry requirements for St John's are 6 grade 4s for applied choices and 4 grade 5s and 2 grade 4s for an A level pathway. For a mixed pathway you must meet the minimum of 6 grade 4s BUT have a minimum of grade 5 in two subjects and meet the specific entry requirements for that course. **Please be aware that Sixth Form courses will only run if there are sufficient numbers.** If you are considering a particular course at university, we would advise you to look at the UCAS website to clarify entry profiles for your chosen field.

We expect to see you at our Induction Day on Wednesday 7th July between 9.15 am and 3.00 pm as this will give you the opportunity to experience a variety of Sixth Form lessons. During the day we will outline to you how you can prepare for your new Sixth Form courses in September so that you can be proactive in preparing for the future. This will involve some summer preparation work that will be available on Induction Day.

Please remember that you will be able to amend your course choices after you have received your GCSE results on Thursday 12th August if places on courses permit. We will be holding our registration for the Sixth Form that day from 10.00 am - midday. This will give you the opportunity to confirm your final choices and discuss any initial concerns.

Finally, I would like to wish you good luck in Year 11 and particularly with your assessments. It is obviously important at this stage to maintain a good work rate and a positive attitude to all your GCSE subjects in order to achieve the best grades possible. We would also expect students to maintain as full an attendance record as possible and be punctual to all lessons. This approach is vital for your future success in the Sixth Form.
