Introduction

The level 3 EPQ is a valuable qualification, highly rated by the best universities in the country. It puts the student in charge and allows them to explore an area of interest to them; this usually overlaps with one or more of their courses. It is worth up to 28 UCAS points, depending upon grade achieved. Students can choose to write a dissertation, conduct an investigation, produce an artefact or perform. Students go on to complete their projects during Year 13 with teacher support throughout the year.

Term 5	Planning and structuring work, updating log and continuing research. Starting to draft own findings.	Research skills, making decisions, resilience	Checking progress
Term 6	Continue to draft own findings and also focus on presentations. Looking at requirements and preparing own PowerPoint slides for presentation. Sharing ideas with others.	Research skills, planning and presentation skills, and group work – sharing of ideas.	Checking presentation work and general progress
