



St John's Curriculum Overview – Year 12



Subject title	Geography
Setting arrangements	Mixed prior attainment
Time allowance each fortnight	9 lessons per fortnight

Introduction

Students follow the AQA A-Level Geography syllabus. The curriculum is split into Human and Physical Geography. Students will have two teachers to deliver the different sides of the course. Assessment takes the form of two exams at the end of the course and the completion of a 3000-4000-word individual investigation which is worth 20%.

Terms 1-3	Contemporary Urban Environments	Coastal systems and landscapes	Numerous skills are honed during the completion of the A-Level Geography course. Of note is the 3000-4000 individual investigation (Worth 20% of A-Level). Students will collect data and begin the write up in Year 12. Skills honed include – data collection, sampling, risk assessment, data presentation, data analysis (Including statistics) and evaluation.	Regular exam practice and end of unit assessments will be utilised. An end of Year exam occurs in term 6 which will test elements from both physical and human geography.

Homework

Students are expected to read around the subject and complete their own research. Homework will be set by class teachers. Revision for end of unit tests and external exams is absolutely crucial.

Additional support and help for the course

Lunch time and after school support sessions are utilised at key assessment points. These will also be available in advance of the final / external examinations.

Extra-Curricular: All A-Level students have to complete four days of fieldwork. Current provision includes a 3-day residential field trip to Nettlecombe FSC in Exmoor (This includes a trip to Bristol en route). A subsequent daytrip to Urchfont and Swindon completes the fieldwork requirement.
