NOT all apprenticeships are on the national apprenticeship site – check the careers/jobs section of **company websites** (search for companies on www.yell.com) Think about your local area and how far you can travel e.g. <https://www.nationwide-jobs.co.uk/early-careers/> and <https://www.nationaltrustjobs.org.uk/where-you-could-work/apprenticeships/>

There may be individual company websites or sector specific e.g. NHS https://www.jobs.nhs.uk/xi/search_vacancy/?action=search&keyword=Apprentice or Civil Service <https://www.civil-service-careers.gov.uk/apprenticeships/>

Check the training providers such as **colleges** and **independent training providers** who may have a range of vacancies e.g. <https://www.newcollege.ac.uk/apprenticeships/current-vacancies/> for New College vacancies. **Adverts** are also found on Job sites e.g. www.indeed.co.uk www.reed.co.uk www.totaljobs.com but be careful about registering with these – you will receive lots of emails!

Ask your own contacts - friends or family may know of businesses that might interest you and you can get to from your address. Large towns will have more opportunities. Also remember that an employer can set up an apprenticeship from scratch if they want you.

Also check online channels as they sometimes advertise here e.g. Facebook, LinkedIn etc...
